October Planning
Applications

Key Application Points

- During the last period there were two new applications.
 - 49.9MW battery energy storage system
 - Alterations and extension to Roadside cottage
- In addition, one prior application has been approved and one refused



Correspondence

- Cllr George Carr (Aberdeenshire Council)
 - Awaiting a report back on potential damage to Pier 3 on the Lower Northwater Bridge. That may take some time until water subsides.
 - Have visited the catastrophic damage at Marykirk on the A937 with Cllr Carnie.
 - Also visited the heartbreaking devastation at Doocot Caravan site at Northwater Bridge.
 - Potholes currently being filled on the alternative diversionary routes.
 - Examining public transport alternatives due to these road and bridge closures.
 - We have some coastal damage at Inverbervie.
 - Will need to assess overall costs over all Aberdeenshire to whether we can trigger Bellwin funding.,
 - Also highlighting the poor communication to residents after the events unfolded. It was not wise for us Cllrs to travel last weekend when travel was not advised so we could only field concerns from residents

Roads and Transport

Catterline Braes – Storm Babet



- No sign of any movement / slips on the upper slopes
- No damage to harbour road
- As expected, given the duration of the storm, wind/wave direction (east) and tides, quite a lot of material from the unprotected section between the concrete wall and the solid section of cliff (where the gabions used to be prior to 2012) has been lost to sea
- There is also material loss from the other side of the concrete wall, behind the concrete blocks
- Some of the big concrete blocks have been moved by the waves
