#### **Data Protection Registration**

It was noted that the Office of Information Commissioner, the UK regulator of Data Protection laws, has determined that all Scotland's Community Councils are "data processors" for the purposes of the Data Protection Acts 1984 and 1998.

This means EVERY CC in the country must annually register with the OIC, pay an annual fee of £35 and nominate one CCllr per CC to be their "data controller."

It is far from cleatr how this added expense and adminstrative burden is going to benefit CKDCC.

#### Auguhirie Wind Farm

A public display for the Hillhead of Auquhirie is planned for Wednesday 7th May from 4pm to 8pm in Kinneff Hall.

#### **Planning**

CKDCC's approach to planning applications and wind farms was discussed. It was felt that our current approach of deciding a general policy to planning applications rather than deciding on each one individually had been successful. It was decided to continue with the current presumption in favour of new development in the area provided it was in keeping and unless there were compelling reasons to object.

Further wind farm applications are possible, but it was felt to be difficult to come to a general policy on these. It was agreed to deal with any wind farm applications on their merits.
