KDP confirmed that due to resources, they were unable to join individual Community Council meetings but will be joining the Community Council Forum on a regular basis.

Platinum Jubilee Coastal Path Project

Progress Update

Entire route has now been surveyed all the way to Cove from St. Cyrus. Most landowners engaged with have been positive interactions. The route has been divided up into 20 sub sections which are currently being written where a report will be shared. River Esk to Inverbervie is now walkable. Next stage is to progress the path to Kinneff which is relatively simple. There remains a few landowners to negotiate with in order to successfully get the path to Catterline from Kinneff. Work South of Stonehaven is also being worked on. Many landowners like the thought of controlled paths and are therefore supportive of the concept.

There is a parallel operation between Aberdeen and Cullen surveying the path for a North of the city route.

An official body (trust) is being raised to continue the project and consider maintenance aspects.

The group is looking for volunteers to monitor the path and bring back issues/concerns to them as well as landowners.

A letter of support for the project was requested to assist with funding and planning applications – it was confirmed that CKDCC will provide this. ACTION Duncan – Write letter

A consideration was raised regarding eider duck and puffin colonies South of Catterline – however, as most of the pathways are on top of the cliffs, it is considered that these

colonies will not be affected. Group is also monitoring migration cycles to further check on this and other factors such as erosion.

Some landowners have agreed to help with the shaping of the paths although contractors will be considered for fences, bridges etc. Most of the funding for this will be coming from things like lottery, coastal funds and even larger organisations to sponsor it.

Access points and the limited parking within our area is being considered.



Police Report



January local report;




Roads and Transport

Kincardine and Mearns area have more potholes than any other area in Aberdeenshire council.

After a period of time and continued worsening of the roads, post office and delivery drivers will refuse to come down the road.



Aberdeenshire council have bundled Catterline, Inverbervie and Johnshaven together to look into solutions to support sea erosion.

The Catterline Harbour Road is key to be able to provide solutions to the bay and should be protected at all costs.
