3. Matters Arising from Minutes

6. Community Funding

- Re St Johns Hill Phil Murray summarized recent events: it has been agreed that the contribution given will be split 50/50 between the two areas of CKDCC and ACC. There will be an additional £10k going directly to Kinneff Village Hall. KDP will be signing the agreement on behalf of the two community councils on 14/2/17 - Phil to advice George Greiss of progress
- Re Upper Criggie Is a separate bank account required for the funds from this community fund donation? Original contact to be checked for details - Debbie Murray to action this and if necessary John Carr (treasurer) to be advised accordingly.

7. List of planning and updates

 Piet voor de Poorte summarized the recent planning applications made (a copy of which had been sent out by email prior to the meeting).

8. Matters arising from planning applications

A point of concern was raised regarding the planning application for a project which has been ongoing and currently under an enforcement order. Reference numbers: 2015/0624, 2016/0099, 2016/3389. It relates to land south of Glasslaw, and the erection of a log cabin, solar panels and polly tunnels, all without planning permission. The applicant has asked for retrospective planning to be granted. CKDCC has objected to this application on two previous occasions. However, the

applicant continues to re-apply, submitting new applications, meanwhile the objections to each of the original applications then "fall" with that original application. Therefore, objections are required to be re-submitted each and every time the applicant submits a fresh, albeit essentially the same, planning application re-submitted.

CKDCC to submit an objection – **Debbie Murray to action this**

Cotbank of Barras – ongoing concern if this site has been re instated as a working quarry. Status to be checked – Cllr Carr to action this

- 23rd December 2016 on the A92 several cars skidded on black ice on the stretch of road between Glasslaw junction / Toucks junction
- mid-January 2017 on the Barras road an incident which resulted in 3 police cars, a fire engine and 2 ambulances being in attendance.

Craigneil Windfarm - John Carr attended a meeting on behalf of CKDCC on 8th December 2106 regarding the Craigneil windfarm.

- there will be 11 large turbines, to maximise output, (total rating 25MW)
- o there are no subsides for the project
- there will be a community fund which will be in line with the Scottish governments guidelines
- the turbines will be visible from the War Memorial in Stonehaven and from the Rickerton area of Stonehaven.
- The turbines are being built on Richard Holman-Baird's land and the build will be in partnership with an Irish electrical company

Noted, Cllr Carr suggested CKDCC should apply for potential funding from at the appropriate time.
