

Police Report




Report attached for August 2019

- Antisocial Behaviour, Violence and Disorder
 - 30 assaults in August (most related to youths in Stonehaven dedicated patrols)
 - 13 assaults (10 detected with remaining 3 positive lines of enquiry
- Acquisitive Crime
 - 13 thefts in August (7 of them by the same person who has been detected)
 - Caravan worth 14k unrecovered
 - 3 housebreakings from the above mentioned group of youths
- Road safety & road crime
 - 2 persons in August charged with drink driving
 - 4 Incident of dangerous driving reported, 1 report and others ongoing enquiry
 - 2 incidents of careless driving reported in August with one being put forward for prosecution considerations
 - 8 speeding ticket issued and 1 car was seized due to no insurance
- PC Michael Urquhart is now the in-post Crime reduction officer and is available to offer advice regarding domestic and commercial security.



Rolling applications would be considered for the Upper Criggie Wind Farm for the future.



At the End of September when the Aberdeenshire planning committee convene, the existing Mill of Uras LDP application could become void with the recent applications standing alone.








Supermarkets were one of the primary concerns in regards to a greener life. Everyone takes something away from the video presentation.



- Emma Storey (Aberdeenshire Council) Annual Networking Event was cancelled due to insufficient CC attendance (only 13 out of 70 accepted with minimum of 30 required). Training sessions will also be offered to CC where they hope to receive feedback how to increase numbers

Roads and Transport • Roddy Aiken (Aberdeenshire Council) sent out bus satisfaction survey report showing an overall increase of 4% in happiness in the service being provided.

107 coastal route was withdrawn and absorbed/replaced by the 747 service. This is affecting Johnshaven and Gourdon businesses with perhaps an argument to reinstate the 107.

Taxi firm attended the last TRAK meeting and was clear it is very regulated and could do with some flexibility in order to remain competitive and competent service

It was raised that the 747 service is appreciated by the community but is also quite restrictive – no early morning buses or late evening services run to coincide with the early and late flights making it difficult for business people. Provide feedback for the 747 service to Roddy Aiken
