February Report below

- **Antisocial Behaviour (39 incidents), Violence and Disorder**
 - 22 incidents involving young people with the rest being neighbour disputes and alcohol fuelled behaviours
 - 5 of these youth issues were related to wing mirrors being damaged with enquires ongoing
 - 14 assaults with 11 detected
 - No Serious assaults for February
- **Acquisitive Crime**
 - 10 thefts in February including 5 incidents of shoplifting which all remain outstanding
 - 5 house break-ins with 1 detected
- **Road safety & road crime**
 - 1 report of drink driving
 - 1 Incident of dangerous driving report to the PF for consideration
 - 4 incidents of careless driving reported, 3 of which passed to PF
 - 14 speeding ticket (2 reports submitted to PF for driving at 52 and 57 in a 30mph zone.

Community Funding and KDP

- St. Johns Hill Wind Farm opens 1st March for applications until 31st May (£15,636.40)
- Retrospective applications for money already spent will not be accepted for the above fund
- Further funding opportunities – please refer to KDP communications that have been forwarded.
- Calor Rural Community Fund pot of £85,000 available for grants up to £5,000. Applications open until 9th April
- Skate ramp proposal assistance to be provided by CKDCC
- SSEN are providing grants up to £3,000 to assist community responses to COVID-19
