- Antisocial Behaviour (35 incidents), Violence and Disorder
 - Significant increases in incidents including neighbour disturbances and some breach of COVID-19 guidelines
 - 3 assaults (down 2) with all of them detected
 - No Serious assaults for April again
- Acquisitive Crime
 - 3 thefts (down 2) in April with one detected and the other two ongoing
 - Zero house break-ins (down 4)
- Road safety & road crime
 - Zero reports of drink driving
 - 1 Incident of dangerous driving report to the PF for consideration
 - 1 incident (down 4) of careless driving reported which has been passed to PF
- North East only 1 arrest for not obeying the lockdown rules with favourable statistics compared to the rest of Scotland
