- Antisocial Behaviour (23 incidents), Violence and Disorder
 - 10 incidents relate to youth annoyance with the majority related to noise /loud music
 - 14 minor assaults with 13 detected and a positive lead on the remaining
 - 1 serious assault for September which has been detected
- Acquisitive Crime
 - 15 thefts in September with four detected and the others ongoing
 - Zero house break-in reported
- Road safety & road crime
 - 1 report of drink driving
 - 1 Incident of dangerous driving report to the PF for consideration
 - Zero incidents of careless driving reported
