### Police Report



#### December only report as per below

- Antisocial Behaviour (49 incidents), Violence and Disorder
  - 15 incidents relate to youth annoyance with the majority related to COVID breaches. The remaining related to noise breaches and vandalism to the Edzell football pitches and goals.
  - 6 assaults with 4 detected and with positive leads to the others
  - 0 serious assaults for December
- Acquisitive Crime
  - 2 thefts in December with one detected and the other ongoing
  - 1 house break-in reported with enquires ongoing
- · Road safety & road crime
  - 1 instance of drink/drug driving
  - 0 Incidents of dangerous driving
  - 0 incidents of careless driving reported
- COVID government guidelines continue to be generally adhered to. It is strongly urged that should anyone become aware of any gatherings taking place within the K&M area that contravene the guidelines, then a call is immediately made to the Police

Appears the work has been conducted and the bridge is now open once again, earlier that the 6 months stated above.
