Police Report



January Police
Report

December report as per below;

- Antisocial Behaviour, Violence and Disorder
 - 21 calls related to antisocial behaviour
 - There were 7 assault Crime Files raised within November with 5 being detected and reported to the Procurator Fiscal and the Youth Justice Management Unit
 - There was 0 serious assault reported during December
- Acquisitive Crime
 - 10 thefts in Kincardine and Mearns. 7 remain undetected
 - Three of the thefts relate to shoplifting offences, two of which were detected and the person responsible reported to the Procurator Fiscal.
 - In St Cyrus, a 33 year old male was charged with a sneak in theft to a residential property where soft furnishings were stolen. He has been reported.
- Road safety & road crime
 - 2 instances of alcohol or drug driving reported, they have been charged and reported
 - 1 Incidents of dangerous driving
 - 4 incidents of careless driving, all of which detected
- Intelligence - Nothing should be considered too small or irrelevant, things like names, nicknames, addresses, descriptions and vehicle registration numbers are all very helpful.

- Ken Duncan (Aberdeenshire Council) – Aberdeenshire Local Outdoor Access Forum(ALOAF) seeking new members
- Ken Duncan (Aberdeenshire Council) – Aberdeenshire council waste collection strategy going to 3 different bins. No sign of glass yet?

Aberdeenshire is one of the worst councils in Scotland for recycling.

There are no facilities in Scotland for paper recycling

Glass will hopefully be collected in the future.

Garden waste will likely have an 'opt-in' option at an additional cost.

The new additional bin would be 180l bin rather than the 240l bins we have already

Aberdeenshire Council is currently paying £9M per year on land fill costs.

It was noted that things should be kept easy for people to be able to recycle and that having a third bin (or potentially a fourth) was not ideal.

Roads and Transport



- Bridge prioritisation document released
- Report into roads asset investment scenarios and projected impacts was distributed
- Nestrans 2040 Regional Transport Strategy formally adopted

Approximately £5M per year has been raised by the increase in council tax which has been committed to be distributed between bridge maintenance and road investment.
