

Community Council Report

This report covers progress we have made in dealing with your priorities for the Kincardine and Mearns Community Council area for the period November 2024.

The report aims to highlight emerging issues in your area, provide crime prevention advice and guidance to Community Council members and the residents you represent. Our focus is to reduce crime and disorder, help create safer communities and respond effectively to local concerns.

In this report I will focus on Police Station 'areas' as historically these stations would covers the following areas.

Portlethen and surrounding areas including Drumoak and Durris. I will specify this as Portlethen.

Stonehaven Police Station – Stonehaven, Newtonhill, Drumlithie and surrounding areas. I will specify this as Stonehaven.

Laurencekirk Police Station – Laurencekirk and surrounding areas including Fettercairn, Edzell woods, Auchenblae and Garvock. I will specify this as Laurencekirk.

The A92 towns (Catterline – St Cyrus) along the coastal Road are covered between Stonehaven and Laurencekirk but I will specify them as Coastal Road.

Officers from the Kincardine and Mearns (K&M) Community Policing Team, supported by our colleagues from Roads Policing continue to carry out high visibility patrols and speed checks across the K&M area. This is in response to concerns raised by the local communities around speeding and inappropriate driving. Officers continue to engage with all road users to promote road safety and where offences are detected will deal proportionately with those who choose to put others at risk. Disappointingly over the past 48 hours officers have had cause to speak with / educate 12 motorists, issue 5 fixed penalties and report 2 road users to the courts for various offences from speeding, no insurance, careless driving and driving whilst using a mobile phone.

Constable Howie from Stonehaven Police Office states 'Road Safety is and continues to be a priority for us all and we will continue to deal with those committing offences in a proportionate manner. I would appeal to all road users to drive safely and considerately, putting your own and others safety at the forefront of your driving / road use.'
