Kinneff School

- Matthew Smart described his role to the meeting;

- Benholm and Johnshaven CC have written to ask if CKDCC has any interest in jointly pursuing speed limits on the A92 where it passes through areas of housing, e.g. Roadside of Catterline, Mill of Uras, Gallaton.
- Cllr Carr raised the issue of the lane closure on Inverbervie bridge, and whether there is a contingency plan to be followed in the event of complete bridge closure.



Responses to Councillor Black from Aberdeenshire council on points raised in the June CKDCC meeting:

 A92 beside Gallaton Farm & houses— when turning left out of the access lane onto the A92 people have been encountered with vehicles on the wrong side of the road overtaking northbound traffic.

Our Roads Safety team have advised that as this is a private access and not a minor road junction, and as such it would not be signed unless there were extenuating circumstances, such as very restricted sightlines. It is estimated that around 200m of visibility exiting the access to the south is achievable due to the visibility splay that has been provided and therefore vehicles will need to wait until vehicles, carrying out a perfectly legitimate overtake, have cleared the access.

Extract from Traffic Signs Manual 4

- 2.2.6. Junction warning signs should be used sparingly where there is a justification. They are not normally provided on very minor rural roads.
- 2) The signage on the Greenden Road (from A957 Dunnottar Avenue) stating 'not suitable for motorised vehicles' is not being effective with motorhomes and cars still using this very narrow road to access the castle and monument. Can further measures be taken.

Our sign shop will <u>look into</u> a possible solution when they return from the summer break in mid-August.



Responses to Councillor Black:

3) Many non-locals are driving down towards the <u>Bervie</u> Braes and finding it closed and having to do manoeuvres to turn in a narrow space, demonstrating that the signage at the junction to A92 is not adequate. Please can a permanent clear sign be placed at the top of Green <u>Den</u> Road indicating that the road down towards the Braes is for access to houses only.

Our sign shop will <u>look into</u> a possible solution when they return from the summer break in mid-August.

4) The bushes around the entrance/exit to the top car park at Dunnottar Woods on the A957 do tend to become very overgrown during the summer season which impedes visibility for those exiting, especially to the right with vehicles coming down the hill from turning off the A92 and speeding up. Can we make sure that this is kept cut back during the growing season.

The area noted above is the responsibility of Forestry Scotland.



Points Arising;

Action: CKDCC secretary to respond to Benholm and Johnshaven CC to confirm that CKDCC is interested in being involved in the initiative to lower speed limits on the A92 through areas of housing.

- There is a "queue" for speed limit revisions based on the number of incidents.
- Arbuthnot CC are looking at revised speed limits. Revisions are based on points allocated according to the number and type of properties in the area. Arbuthnot has 14 points. Councillor Black will circulate Aberdeenshire Council's Speed limit Policy.

- Catterline Playpark
 - 1. When will the swings be restored? / Are they under maintenance by Aberdeenshire council?
